Today there are a number of different types of hearing aids that can help children to hear better, but parents need information. Barnplantorna and Sahlgrenska University Hospital, producers of an information film on cochlear implants ("Cochlear Implants – A New Sense of Hearing"), have now released a new information film on bone anchored hearing aids.

The bone anchored hearing aid, or Baha®, can help children with conductive hearing loss caused by the partial or total dysfunction of the middle ear, ear canal or outer ear. One of the project leaders, Radi Jönsson, Doctor at Sahlgrenska University Hospital, says:

"There are no statistics on the number of children who could benefit from bone anchored hearing aids, but whose parents don't receive the necessary information."

The film gives you answers to the question of who can hear through bone conduction.

Meet the families, children and young people and school staff. Get a unique insight into how bone-anchored hearing aids work. If your child is a candidate for bone anchored hearing aid / Baha® the film will take you through the whole process from investigation and surgery to hearing aid fitting.

You will no doubt also be curious about the development of bone-anchored hearing aids. Meet the Innovators Dr. Anders Tjellström and Professor Bo Håkansson, who describe an interdisciplinary cooperation at the Sahlgrenska University Hospital and Chalmers University of Technology in Gothenburg.

The parents' involvement in the family intervention concerning their children is important. The film will support you in making well-informed decisions for habilitation (family intervention) and choice of preschools and schools for your children. Whether you are a parent, a relative, or work in preschools, schools or habilitation, it is likely you will see the film over and over again.
